

# Clark/Illinois Walk 0.8 miles



- 1 1700 Clark** Built in 1858 as a one-story cottage across Division, it was moved here in 1883 and enlarged in 1911 to 2 1/2 stories. Changes made around 1945 gave the house a more colonial look.
- 2 1708 Clark** A surprise gift in 1886 - a local lumberman's daughter was unaware of her home's existence until her carriage stopped in front of it! The Queen Anne style shows in its ornate shingles, two-story bay window, and colored glass windows in the tower.
- 3 1717 Clark** The rough granite lower story created quite a stir in 1909. The newspapers called it "the first cobblestone residence" in the city. The versatile first owner was a dentist, an owner of a poster advertising company, a car salesman, and a secret-service agent in World War I.
- 4 1900 Clark** Although this large 1905 home is still majestic, it has lost much of its original ornate detail, such as appliqué laurel wreaths and rafter-end brackets under the eaves. It is being restored.
- 5 2000 Clark** This 1902 house is a delightful example of the Dutch Colonial style of architecture. Notice the peculiar curving of the fish-scale shingles into the 3rd story window.
- 6 2101 Clark** Remodeled many times, the house dates from about 1880. This is one of the few properties left in town with a barn in back. Keeping a cow was common in the days before milkmen made deliveries or fresh milk was available in stores.
- 7 1202 Illinois** This beautiful Tudor half-timbered house was built in 1932. Notice the clay chimney pot and the front doorway gable peak. The first owner, known as one of the county's most successful bootleggers during and after Prohibition, owned many restaurants, taverns, and real-estate properties.
